President's Message

The 2010-2011 school year will soon begin and we look forward to welcoming the freshmen class for Freshmen Orientation on **Friday, August 20th** and all students back to school on **Monday, August 23rd**. Following summer vacations we look forward to the energy and enthusiasm that students, faculty and staff bring to the new school year.

We hope that your family will benefit from the **Back-to-School Sales Tax Holiday** that was signed into law on July 7th. The tax holiday will begin August 6 and last through August 15, 2010. During this window, Illinois state taxes on clothing and school supplies will be reduced by 5% to 1.25% (instead of 6.25%). Other Local County and City taxes will still apply.

For the purposes of this Tax Holiday, "Clothing" is defined as all human wearing apparel suitable for general use. Each item purchased must meet this definition and have a retail selling price of less than \$100. The list of eligible "Clothing" items includes, but is not limited to: school uniforms, belts, neckties, underwear, socks and stockings, coats and jackets, hats and caps, ear muffs, gloves and mittens, scarves, rainwear, shoes and shoelaces, sneakers, boots and sandals.

The legislation defines "School Supplies" as items used by a student in a course of study. "School supplies" includes, but is not limited to: binders, book bags, calculators, cellophane tape, blackboard chalk, compasses, composition books, crayons, erasers, folders (expandable, pocket, plastic, and manila), glue, paste, highlighters, index cards, index card boxes, legal pads, lunch boxes, markers, notebooks, paper (including loose leaf ruled notebook paper, copy paper, graph paper, tracing paper, manila paper, colored paper, poster board,

and construction paper), pencils, pencil leads, pens, ink, pencil boxes and other school supply boxes, pencil sharpeners, protractors, rulers, scissors and writing tablets.

We hope that your family will benefit from the sales tax break as you prepare to return your daughter to Res. School supplies needed for your daughter will depend on her individual classes. When classes begin teachers will inform your daughter about specific supplies that may be needed for a particular course, but you may want to stock up on basic supplies during the sales tax holiday.

The new early dismissal Activity Day will be on Wednesdays. The reason for this change is to ensure consistency in the class schedule following holiday weekends. Because period 7 does not meet on Activity Days, we found that teachers and students would not meet for an extended period of time following a long weekend when the Activity Day was on Tuesday. With the Activity Day being moved to Wednesday, the class schedule will allow consistency for the period 7 classes.

Please mark your calendar for **Back-to-School Night on Wednesday, September 1st** at 6:45 pm and the **Parents Club Meeting on Tuesday, September 21st** at 7pm. We look forward to welcoming you back to Resurrection as we begin another wonderful year filled with the Spirit of knowledge, faith, and growth!

Res Awarded Blue Ribbon in Health Education

Resurrection College Prep High School has been selected as the first private school in Illinois to receive a Blue Ribbon in Health Education. The Blue Ribbon Award in Health Education was developed as a joint effort between Illinois School Health Association (ISHA) and Illinois Association of Health, Physical Education, Recreation and Dance (IAHPERD). The goal of the health education curriculum at Resurrection College Prep High School is the development of attitudes, values, and skills necessary for students to lead physically, socially, and emotionally healthy lives.

In order to qualify for the award, Resurrection College Prep High School completed a self-study of the school's health curriculum and reviewed the school's curriculum goals and objectives, content, and instructional strategies. The completed self-study was then submitted to the Blue Ribbon Committee for further review and a team from the ISHA and IAHPERD

visited Resurrection for an in-depth look at the program. The award was developed using guidelines established by the Illinois Learning Standards, the Illinois School Code, and the National Health Education Standards.

At Resurrection, health and wellness are promoted through various programs and practices. Fitness, disease prevention, character development and mental health are all addressed at Resurrection. "This award validates the support that our health curriculum has from other disciplines in the school community," said Marcia Berke, Chair of the Resurrection Physical Education Department. The Blue Ribbon Award recognizes high quality high school health programs in Illinois. Resurrection is only the 7th high school in Illinois to receive this prestigious award.

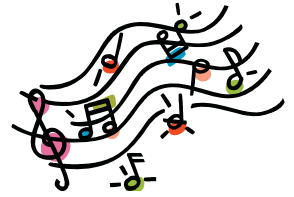
