# Dean's Message

As summer vacation beckoned to our students, we heard their excitement about completing the school year. Student discussions revolved around summer plans: vacations, summer jobs and those cool summer mornings, getting some extra zzzzz's, were all at the forefront of their conversations.

The change from the academic year to summer provides students with time to do what they like best: socialize with their friends and enjoy summer weather and activities. Their favorite eateries, city parks and county forest preserves offer space for socializing. However, local authorities and merchants recently have written us that teen behavior in our neighborhood has put them and residents at risk.

*Spontaneous, large gatherings of teens occur thanks to their ability to text the "where and when" to their friends, who in turn, send the message along to other teens.* These gatherings are not planned beyond location and time. In short order, everyone is assembled. The activities that evolve sometimes become disruptive, dangerous and illegal.

Commander McNaughton, of the Chicago Police Department's 16th district, recently advised us of large numbers of teens gathering at St. Thecla's school grounds. Underage drinking, urinating in public and conflicts with school neighbors were reported to the police. Similarly, the Archdiocese and Chicago Police reminded school officials that last year, more than 100 Catholic high school students assembled at Lake Michigan's North Avenue beach.

Drinking and fighting occurred, and several students were arrested or sent to Northwestern Hospital for injuries and alcohol poisoning. Last year after Edison Park Fest more than 400 teens assembled at Olympia Park, causing police to have to shut down Avondale Avenue. The impact on neighborhood residents was profound.

Schools, merchants and law enforcement want students to enjoy their summer. Additionally, we remind students that they have the responsibility to be respectful citizens. *We know our students to be respectful and responsible young women here. They are the women of Resurrection College Prep. We expect them to reflect this behavior during the summer, no matter where they are.*

Recently, Chicago Fire Department Chief Nielson advised our juniors and seniors at Operation Prom to develop a plan about how to respond when a situation turns dangerous. We agree that this is a good strategy. *We encourage you to talk with your daughter about how to recognize if a gathering is becoming disruptive or dangerous and then develop a plan with her about how she can move herself out of harm's way.*

We look forward to our students' return on August 18th, when we will be regaled with stories about the joyous times they had during the Summer of 2011.

## Congratulations Class of 2011

**One hundred and seventy-one young** women celebrated their graduation as the Resurrection Class of 2011. A Baccalaureate Mass was held on Tuesday, May 31, 2011 at St. John Brebeuf in Niles and the graduation ceremony was held on Wednesday, June 1, 2011 at the Pickwick Theatre in Park Ridge. At the Resurrection Baccalaureate Mass thirty-four graduating seniors presented their mothers or grandmothers with roses. These special mothers were Resurrection alumnae who were celebrating the Baccalaureate Mass as part of their daughter's graduation.

The June 1st graduation ceremony, held at the Pickwick Theatre in Park Ridge, broke with the traditional alumnae address for the commencement. This year seniors were invited to compete for the honor of giving the commencement address. The student selected was **Maria Canzoneri**, who is an example of a student who has carried on the Resurrection alumnae heritage. Her mother, three aunts, and three cousins are all Resurrection alumnae and her cousin, **Katy Casey**, also graduated with the Resurrection Class of 2011. As part of Maria's commencement address, in her own version of "truth or dare", she dared her classmates to *"be open to new ideas, new people, and new opportunities... I dare us to put ourselves out there and not be afraid of rejection. I dare us to be women of strength, courage and independence."*

Two high achieving students who presented the traditional "Student Reflections" at the graduation ceremony were Jennifer Hilger and Sara Sedivy. During the graduation ceremony, **Jennifer Hilger** spoke to her classmates about the changes in their lives and the changes in the world at large. *"Undoubtedly"* she said, *"change is in our future, but it is up to us to decide who is in control of that change."*

**Sara Sedivy**, who presented the second "Senior Reflection", urged her classmates to *"remember that life is 10% what happens to us and 90% how we react to it."* She reminded the graduates that *"Attitude has a great impact on life because we have the ability to control our outlook on life and on circumstances. So, choose to stay positive."*

The Resurrection **Class of 2011** included **19 Illinois State Scholars** and the 171 graduates were awarded **over \$6 million in college scholarships.**

## ResPunzel

On Tuesday, May 24th over 10% of Resurrection College Prep High School students donated 8 or more inches of hair to the **ResPunzel Project**, which began in March 2009. The project, hosted by the Resurrection Science Club, allows students and staff the opportunity to donate hair which will be used to make wigs for cancer patients. Last year 26 participants at Res donated, including 24 students and two staff members. The goal this year was to receive 30 or more hair donations and that **goal was far exceeded, with a total of 72 participants** donating hair to the ResPunzel Project.

Two hair stylists from Salon M in Niles, including Res alumna **Maggie Bujak '04** and Stefanie Groggin, volunteered their services to cut the hair of faculty, staff and students. ## Res Alumna Discovers New Virus

On May 18th Resurrection students had the opportunity to listen to a presentation from Resurrection alumna **Emilia Czyszczon '09** about her discovery of a new virus, which bears her name: the Czyszczon1. Emilia is an undergraduate research student at Purdue University studying biological engineering. In the course of her research, she has discovered a previously unidentified virus, a bacteriophage that is capable of killing a form of bacteria that is similar to the bacteria in tuberculosis and leprosy. The discovery of this new virus may lead to future research in the treatment of antibiotic resistant tuberculosis.

In August 2010, Emilia took a soil sample from the wall of a cave in Bedford, Indiana, which contained glacial mud that Emilia tested in the labs at Purdue University. During the testing, Emilia discovered the previously unidentified virus, which is a class of bacteria that has been relatively unstudied. After the development of penicillin during World War II, research on bacteriophages was minimal, until recently. Now, new research focuses on alternatives to antibiotic treatment.

Twenty year old Emilia Czyszczon's research originated as part of the Purdue University project that is affiliated with the Howard Hughes Medical Institute's funding to assist with the National Genomics Research Institute. With the financial assistance of Purdue University faculty members, Emilia sent her virus for DNA sequencing. She then obtained a research grant to perform additional research and she is currently documenting the genes and proteins on the DNA sequence of Czyszczon1.

Emilia's parents, Andrzej and Grazyna Czyszczon, are both engineers and her brother is currently an engineering student in Michigan. Before she began college at Purdue University, Emilia anticipated majoring in neuroscience and she had plans to continue on to medical school. She then reconsidered the field of engineering and changed her major to biological engineering. Last summer, Emilia lived and worked at Argonne National Laboratory in a summer intern program. One of Emilia's stated goals is to win a Nobel Prize, and this summer she will be working on documenting the DNA sequence of her newly discovered virus.

*"Life should be unpredictable,"* said Emilia during her presentation to Resurrection students on May 18th. *"If you are going to fail, fail big. If you don't, you're never going to make a difference. Creativity is allowing yourself to make mistakes."* In her closing comments, she advised, *"Seek a real purpose. Seek to make a difference."*

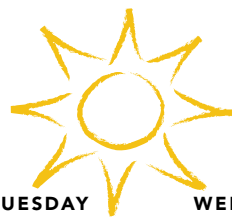
