Parents and students -

A family of Resurrection College Prep notified school leadership on November 4, 2020, that a student tested positive for COVID-19 from a test administered on November 3, 2020. We have assurances from our staff that our safety standards (masks, social distancing and hand sanitation) were followed the entire time students were on campus. We are unable to provide any additional information regarding this individual due to federal privacy laws. The student was last on campus on October 30, 2020.

What does this mean for you?

The Cook County Department of Public Health only requires quarantine if you have been exposed to someone who is Covid positive for 15+ minutes within 6 feet. If your daughter has been following the 3 steps we have stressed (properly wear a mask, wash/sanitize your hands regularly, maintain social distance) then she would not fall into the category of an individual who has been in close contact to a confirmed or probable COVID-19 case.

However, it is important that you remain diligent in monitoring for symptoms or fever. If those symptoms develop, please do not send your daughter to school. Rather, remain home that day and report the symptoms to the school. The school may require that you take a Covid test before returning.
